

Pizza Waffles

Makes four.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (14-ounce) tube pizza dough or homemade pizza dough
- 4 tablespoons marinara sauce
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella
- 12 slices pepperoni

PREPARATION

Slice the pizza dough into 8 equal pieces, then press each piece flat. Place 4 pieces of dough into a preheated, greased waffle iron. Spread one tablespoon of marinara, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of mozzarella, and 3 slices of pepperoni on each piece of dough. Top with the 4 remaining pieces of dough and seal. Cook for 3-5 minutes, until golden brown, then serve.

Lifetime Study Update

Hemangiosarcoma is a dreaded problem in Golden Retrievers. Dr. Sharon Albright, a vet in the Lifetime study reviewed it with the following highlights. This particular cancer accounts for up to 3% of all canine tumors and has a mean age of 9-12 years. It is most common in the spleen or the heart but often not diagnosed until it is too late and there is a rupture.

So what can we do? Understand the following signs that could be indicators, although not always specific to one problem. Things like lethargy or anorexia may occur. But as cited by Dr. Albright, “unfortunately a common presentation is collapse, increased heart and respiratory rates, and pale mucous membranes caused by a substantial hemorrhage of a ruptured tumor.”

You can learn to look at your dog’s mucous membranes by lifting his/her upper lip and examining the color of the lip and gums. Evaluate the pink areas regularly in various degrees of light and learn what is the normal for your dog. For this disease prompt diagnosis and treatment can be a critical key to survival. The Lifetime Study is assessing hemangiosarcoma along with so many other diseases and we try to determine factors and links in maintaining the health and quality of life for our wonderful Golden Retrievers.


